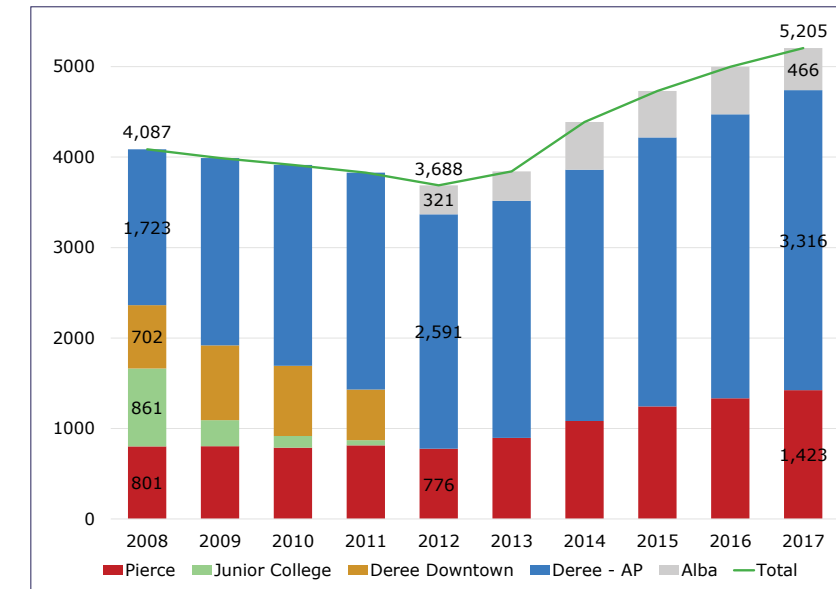

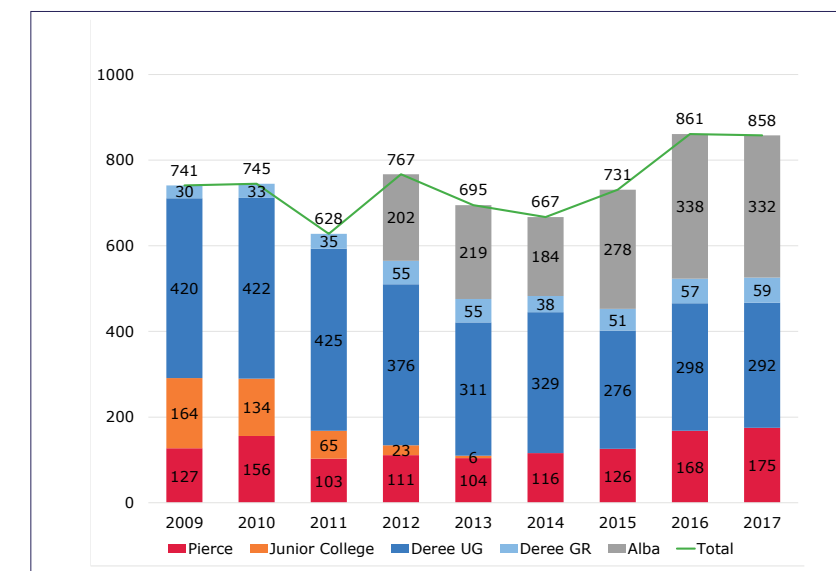

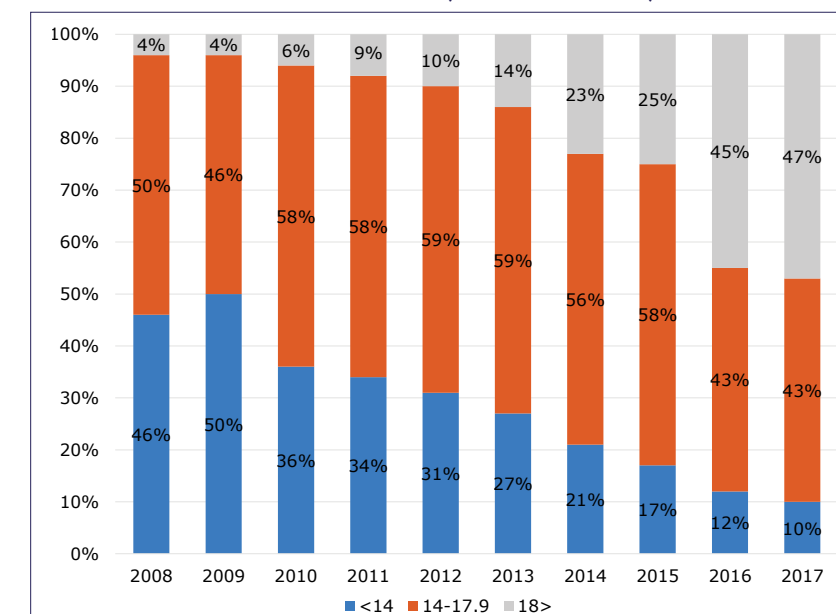
ACG FALL TOTAL ENROLLMENT



ANNUAL GRADUATES (HEADCOUNT)



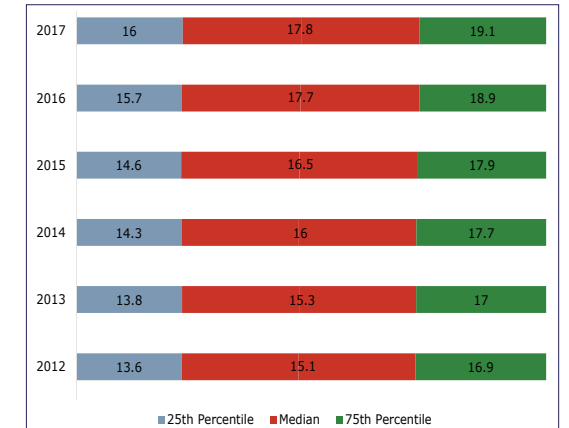
UNDERGRADUATE ACADEMIC MIX (NEW STUDENTS)

New Pierce Principal: Eric Trujillo



Eric Trujillo was appointed Principal of Pierce College in July 2017, following the completion of Olga Julius' tenure. Previously, he was Headmaster of Üsküdar American Academy, Istanbul, Turkey from 2010 to 2015. From 2003 – 2007, he was Director (Head) of American Collegiate Institute – Pierce's "twin institution" – and SEV Elementary School, Izmir, Turkey. Earlier, he taught and was Dean of Students at Tarsus American College, Tarsus, Turkey (1996 – 2001) and teacher and Principal at American Elementary School, Gdynia, Poland (1992 – 1996). Eric holds a BA (1988), Political Science (Colorado State University), a MA (1999), Education, Secondary Administration and Supervision (University of Phoenix) and did doctoral studies in Educational Leadership at Colorado State University (2001 – 2010).

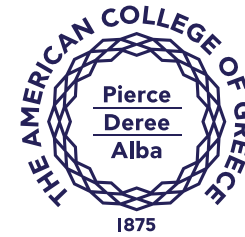

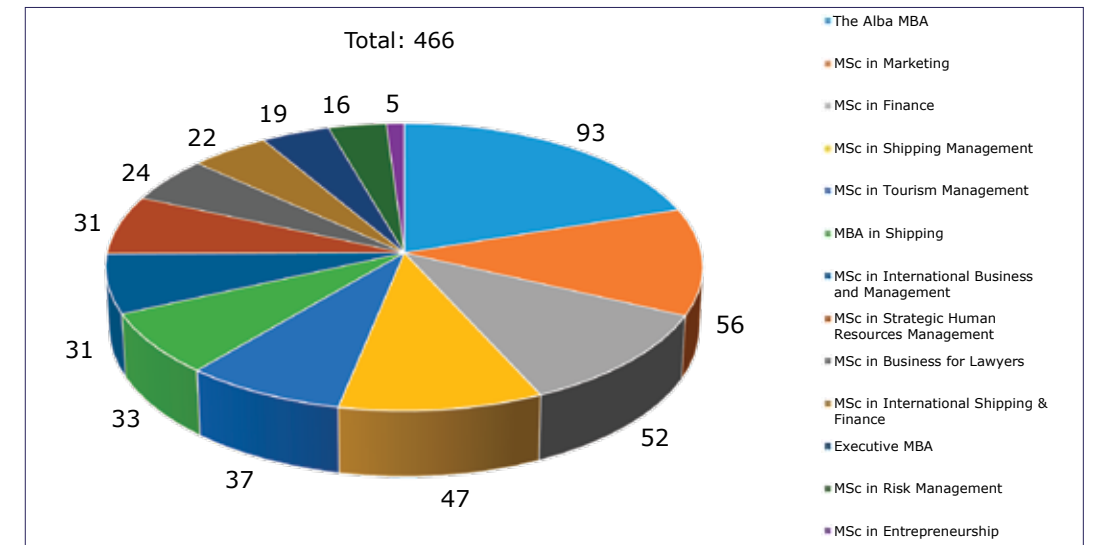

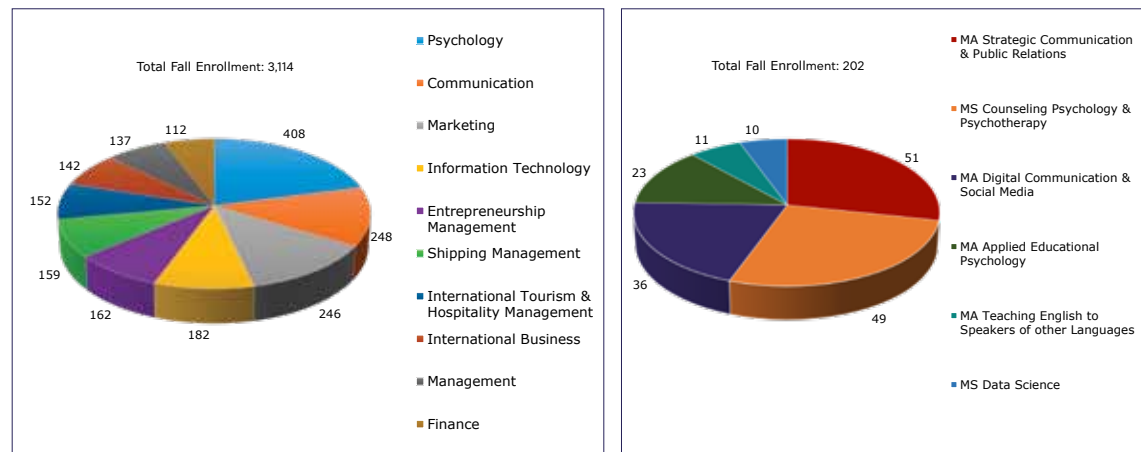

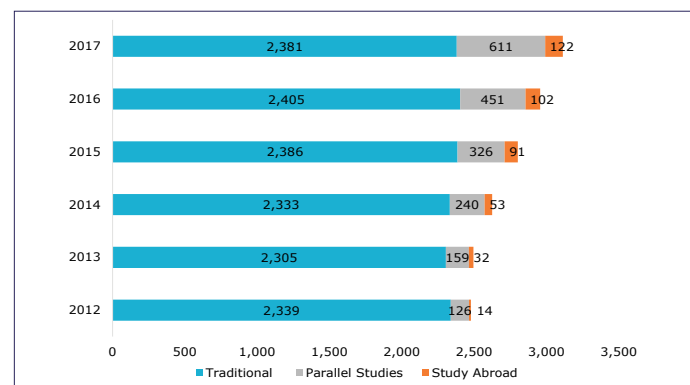
DEREE 2017 TOP TEN UNDERGRADUATE MAJORS 2017 DEREE GRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAMS



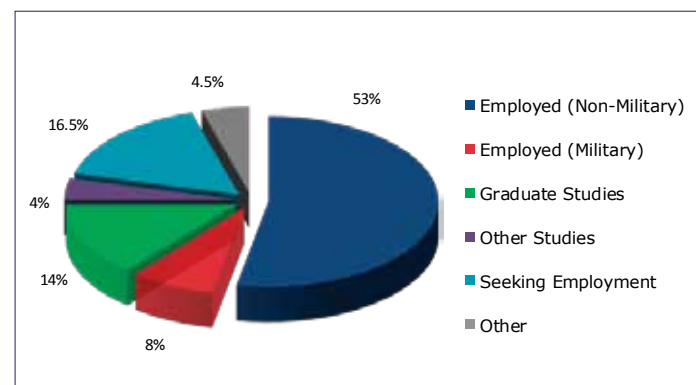

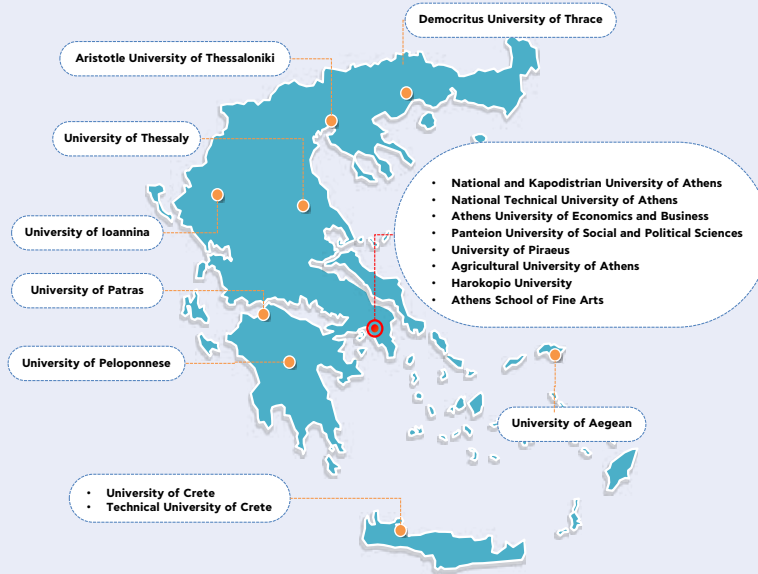

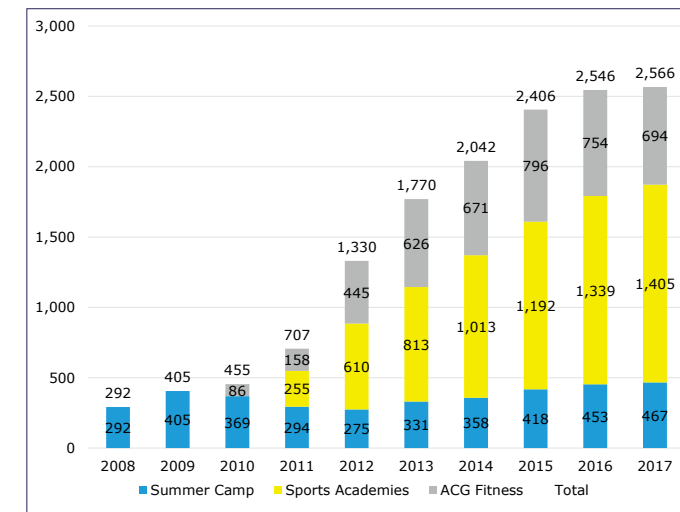

Deree Graduate Psychology Collaboration with Municipality of Athens



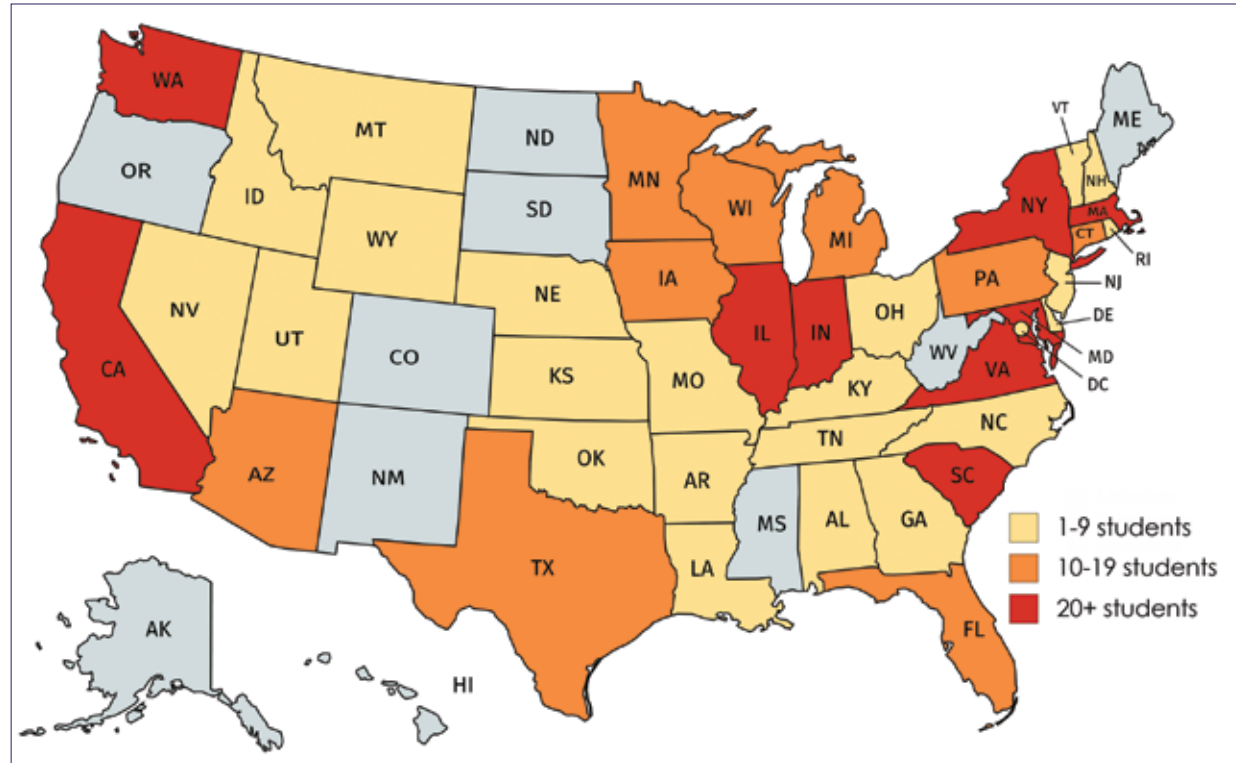

National Hellenic Society

Sponsored by the National Hellenic Society (NHS) and hosted by The American College of Greece, Heritage Greece is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for participants to explore their Hellenic heritage, culture, and identity with a peer group of students from the United States and Greece. Participants acquire Greek language skills within the context of modern Greece, and travel to important archaeological and historic locations. 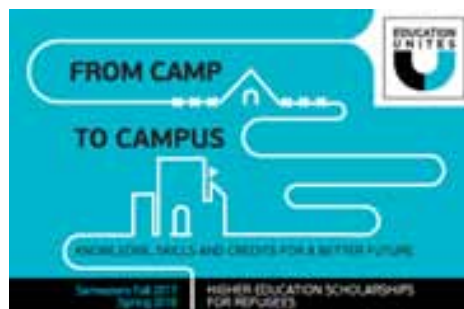

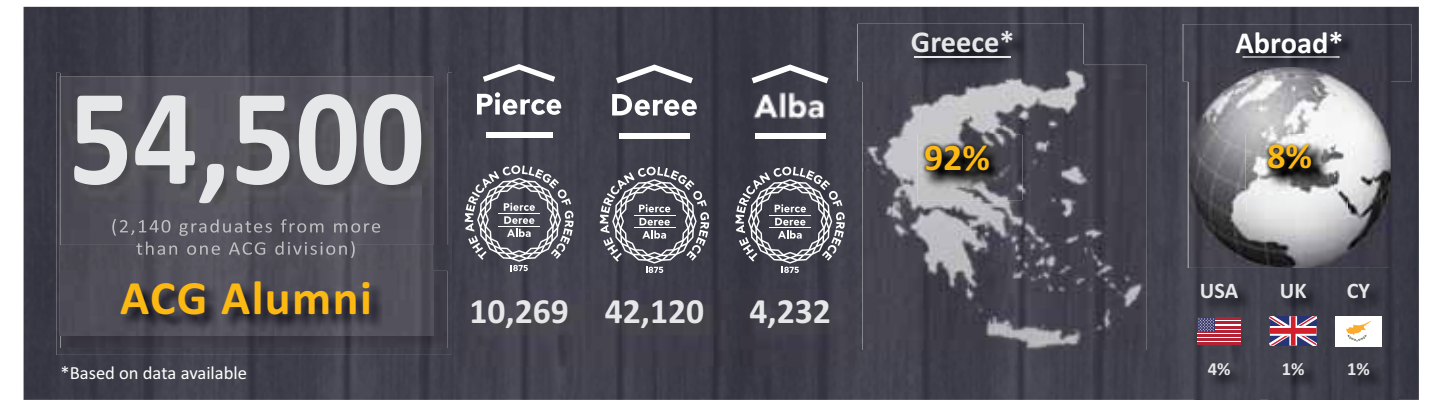

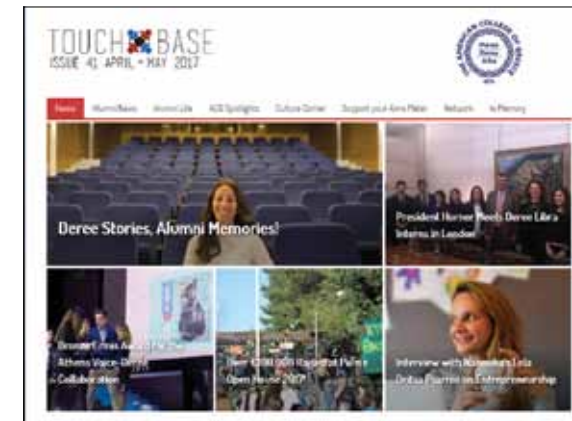
President Horner was interviewed by *Naftemporiki*, Greece's leading financial newspaper and *Proto Thema*, Greece's best-selling Sunday paper.

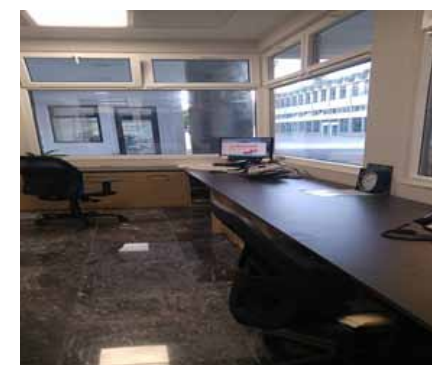
Pierce Christmas Bazaar

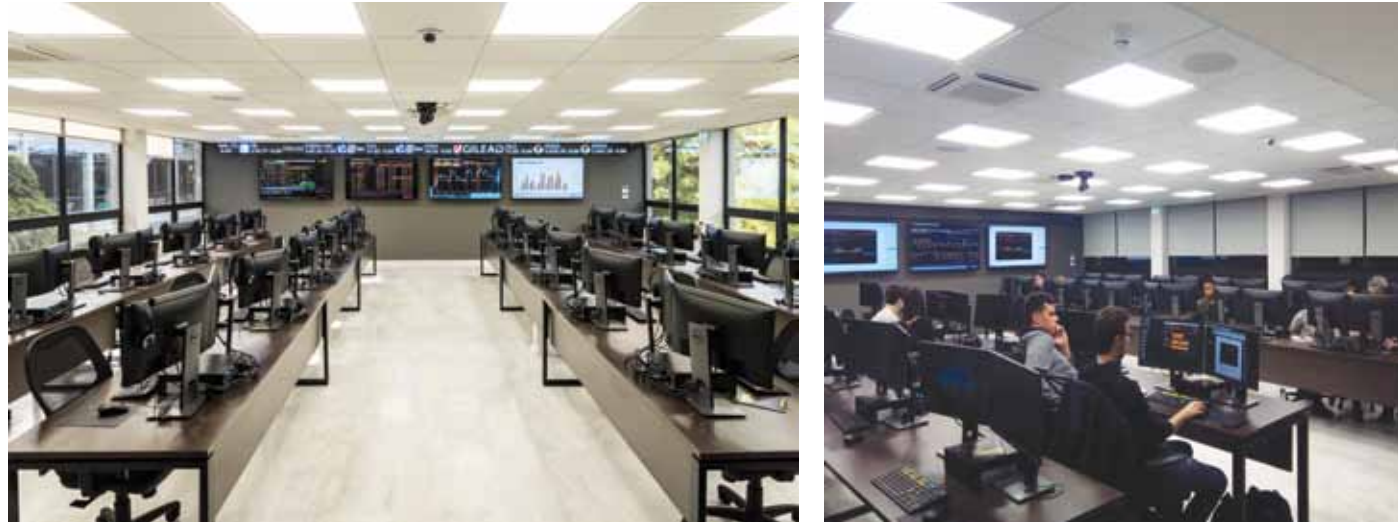

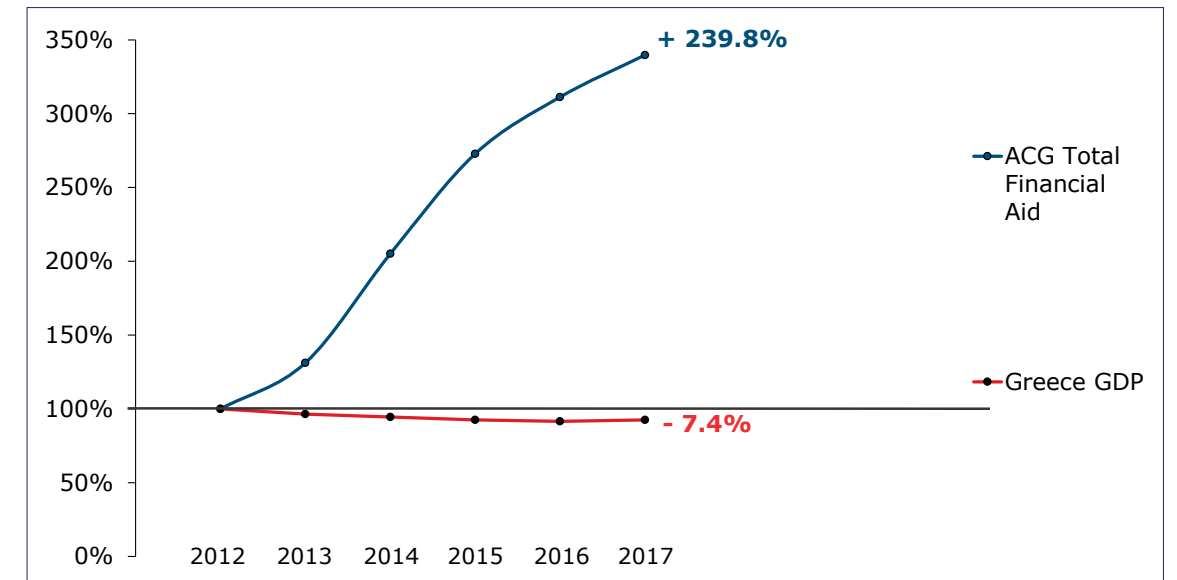
Simulated Trading Room

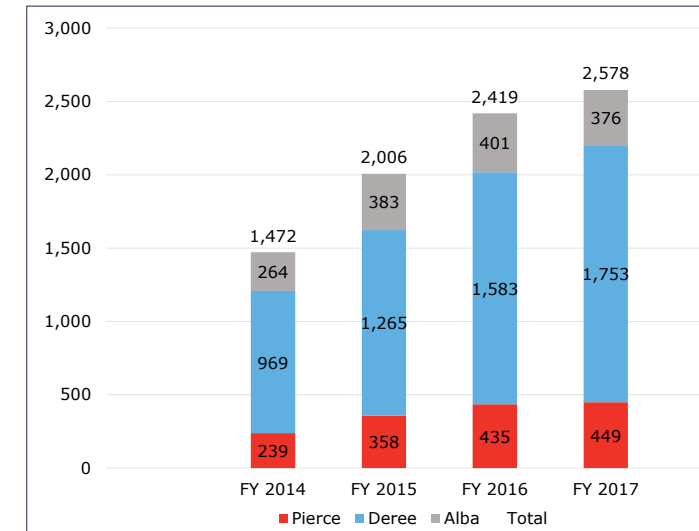

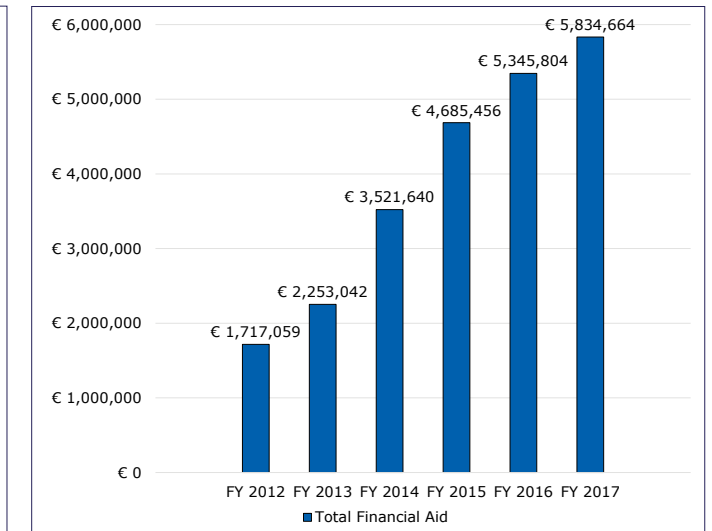
ACG Carbon Footprint

In December 2017, ACG's Green House Gas emissions were inventoried as an initial step in mapping ACG's carbon footprint and becoming a more energy efficient campus.

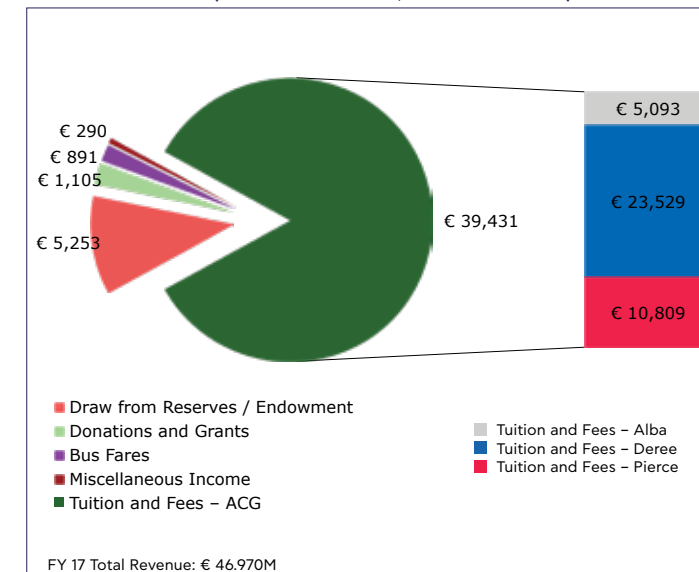
ACG FINANCIAL AID RECIPIENTS (HEADCOUNT)



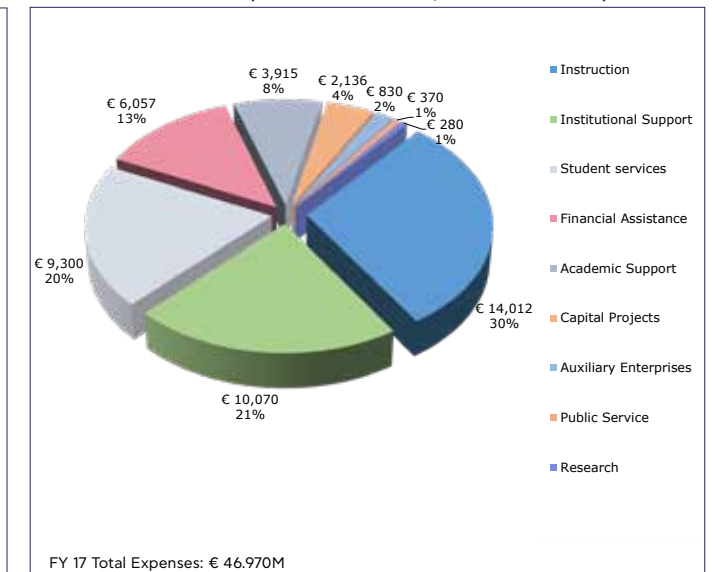
